Neighbors optimistic about plans for Chippewa Lake park land

LAFAYETTE TOWNSHIP -- A fisherman toting a rod and pail past a rusting turnstile praises a plan to turn a decrepit amusement park into a wellness resort.

"It'll build the economy in this area," said Gary Burton, who has lived beside Chippewa Lake Park and frequented its crumbling pier since about 1978, when the beloved 100-year-old park locked its gates. If the planned Chippewa Landing resort brings too much bustle to this hamlet southwest of Medina, Burton might cash in on it. "Maybe I'll sell my house and move out where there's no one," he said. Chippewa Partners, a group of developers from Arizona and California, has bought the 95-acre park and won zoning approval for a resort. They hope to submit plans in the next 30 days for a wellness center, a 110-room hotel, a 1,000-person concert hall, a spa, shops and more. The developers want to later add homes, either clustered or detached. The resort would flank Chippewa's 330 acres of water, Ohio's biggest natural lake aside from Lake Erie. Gary managing member of Chippewa Partners, hopes to start construction next spring and open the resort about 18 months later. He said it was too soon to estimate the project's square footage or cost. Township Trustee Lynda Bowers said the township might grant several years' worth of aid called tax increment financing. But she vowed not to do anything that would reduce the Cloverleaf School District's revenue from the property. The developers' land includes several dozen houses outside the park. Most are cottages, many of them on dirt and gravel roads. Bowers and Sills said developers would keep the homes, improve the roads and help residents form homeowners associations. Sills also plans plenty of work to reduce the shore's frequent floods. A few residents worry about the proposed resort's traffic and noise. Many welcome the improvements. "Better than letting it sit the way it was," Patricia Gbur said. For decades, families enjoyed the park's rides, and music fans filled the ballroom to hear stars such as Glenn Miller, Lawrence Welk and the Kinks. After the park closed, nature and arson leveled most of the structures, including the ballroom and a bathhouse. Now, the place is full of rubble, poison ivy and "Danger" signs. Lingering relics include a rusty Ferris wheel. Sills said he might save it a tribute to the park's past. Last year, the Medina County Park District bought the lake and a stretch of western shore land. Director Tom James hopes to start work late this year or early next year on a boat launch, wading beach, picnic shelter and hiking trails on 225 acres.

This year, Chippewa Partners paid \$3.15 million for the amusement grounds on the eastern shore. The land includes 15 acres in Westfield Township, but the buyers have made plans so far for only the 80 acres in Lafayette Township. They announced Tuesday that the wellness center would be run by Akron General Medical Center, which has two similar centers elsewhere. On the rise nationwide, wellness centers are like fitness centers but are staffed by medical professionals who supervise clients' workout programs. Doug Ribley, Akron General vice president for wellness, said the new location has spectacular views, especially at sunset. He spoke as a professional and a hobbyist: He and his family compete nationally on the Chippewa Lake Water Ski Show Team.
