**Recipe for Oriental Salad by Phylliss Papp
Night Before**

2 Packages of Ramen Noodles without seasoning

Break up into fine pieces. Melt ½ cup butter and stir with noodles covering all the noodles with butter. Cook till brown. After browned put in a bowl and put in refrigerator.

1 Head of Bok Choy or Nappa cabbage chopped fine.

5 Green onions sliced using part of green stem

Mix Bok Choy and onions with noodles you refrigerated.

Add Dressing

1 cup granulated sugar

1 cup vegetable oil (not olive oil)

¼ cup white vinegar

2 tablespoons soy sauce

Stir till sugar dissolves and then toss together.

Refrigerate overnight.

P.S. At the picnic I used Bok Choy, but I usually use Nappa Cabbage.
