Message from the President Terry Stahurski

I got an email from the Ohio Gold Prospectors club who is looking for a speaker for their Labor Day get together. They need a speaker on Sunday Sept. 6th. As you can see from the email below, they would like someone to talk about the basics of metal detecting and underwater detecting. It would probably be good to have some displays of stuff found as well. They said they would give our club a table for the show in case we wanted to display anything about the club. I would recommend that if a detectorist were to speak generally about how metal detectors work then hit a few basics like ground balancing and tuning adjustments and move toward target hunting and ultimately, underwater detecting followed by a brief Q&A, it would hold the attention of our average listener. We will have members of all levels of detecting experience and such a format would definitely have something for everyone. I imagine such a presentation would take in the neighborhood of 45 minutes.
